Something to Say at the Tish

After returning from defeating the army of Midyan, Moshe goes out to greet the victorious soldiers. He notices among the spoils of war are captive women and children. Instead of complementing them on a job well done, Moshe gets angry at the generals for not completing their job. The men were all killed out, but why were the women allowed to live? Moshe felt that since the women were the cause of the sin resulting in the death of 24,000 Yidden, they too should have been killed along with the men.

Right after the above ma'asah, the Posuk relates that Elazar HaKohen taught the laws of how to kasher keilim that were previously owned by a non-Jew thereby permitting them to be used. Rashi points out that since Moshe got angry, he forgot this halachah, necessitating it to be taught by Elazar. Rashi brings two other places where Moshe got angry and each time it led to a mistake. It seems that this time Moshe's anger was justified. After all, the army did not fully carry out the task they were sent to do. They needed to be reprimanded harshly in order to rectify the mistake. Whey then is Moshe punished with forgetting the halachah?

To answer this guestion we have to understand the nature of anger. When a person gets angry, they allow their emotions to take over their intellect. They are not in control of their thoughts. It is only natural to forget things or make mistakes. Moshe forgetting the halachah was not a punishment, rather a natural consequence of getting angry. We have to be careful not to get angry even when anger is called for and, all the more so, when it is not.







