## Rabbi Tzvi Finkel

On that fateful day that the meraglim returned from spying Eretz Yisroel, the B'nei Yisroel cried the entire night not to go into Eretz Yisroel. Hashem said, "Because you cried for no reason, I will give you something to cry about." Years later the Bais Hamikdash was destroyed on Tisha b'Av the same night that the meraglim returned.

When Moshe was presented with the original idea of sending meraglim, the B'nei Yisroel came as an angry mob. There was utter chaos and confusion as the youngsters were pushing their elders. Each person needed to be the one to speak because they couldn't agree on one leader to represent everyone. This comes from not being able to get along with one another. Why should someone else take credit for my idea? Why should someone else be my representative if I am so much better than him? These are the types of arguments made when there is no unity. Contrast this with the request that was made on Har Sinai. (The people were frightened from hearing the Aseres Hadibros directly from Hashem and asked if Hashem would speak to Moshe alone who would then tell them over to the B'nei Yisroel.) The leaders came first, followed by the elders, followed by the rest of the nation. They were able to come in an organized manner showing respect to those deserving respect. By Har Sinai they were united - there was achdus - as was evident by the way the request was presented.

The result of sending meraglim was the destruction of the Bais Hamikdash. Chazal say the Bais Hamikdash was destroyed because of sinas chinam - baseless hatred - and a lack of unity, which was rooted in the request of sending the meraglim. If we work on getting along with each other, putting aside our differences, united as one nation, we can be zocheh to see the rebuilding of the Bais Hamikdash, b'meheira v'yameinu.
